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

U.N. special envoy on Afghanistan in Tehran for talks

TEHRAN - The special envoy of the U.N. secretary general on Afghanistan, Lakhdar Brahimi arrived here Tuesday for a 2-day talks with senior Iranian officials, including Foreign Minister Kamal Kharrazi.

Brahimi will follow up the U.N. Security Council resolutions on Afghanistan and the decisions of the 6+2 group in New York.

Six neighbors of Afghanistan, namely Iran, Pakistan, China, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan, plus Russia and the U.S. are members of 6+2 group which held a ministerial meeting on the sidelines of the U.N. General Assembly meeting in New York in September.

After visiting Iran, Brahimi is expected to fly to Islamabad to hold talks with Pakistani officials on the Afghan crisis.

President Khatami in meeting with Kuwaiti speaker

Iran seeks peace, understanding in region

TEHRAN - President Mohammad Khatami in a meeting with the Speaker of Kuwait's National Assembly, Ahmad al-Saadun here Tuesday stressed the close and good ties existing between Iran and other Islamic countries, particularly Kuwait.

He told the Kuwaiti speaker, "we are not at war with the world. However we want to say we are a historical ummah and have every right to live, not wage war. Due to this very reason we ask the countries which are the members of the Islamic family to respect international norms as well as the principles of peace and understanding because the grounds for peace will be created in this way," IRNA reported.

The greatest problem facing the Islamic countries today is the Palestine issue, said the president. He believed that the Islamic countries should do more for them than what they have so far done because a far larger number of displaced Palestinians live in various locations around the world than what actually live within the Palestinian territory.

A cruel regime in now ruling over this usurped territory of Palestine which yearns for unending bribes from the Palestinians, the governments and peoples of the region, said the chief executive.

He reiterated Iran's desires for peace and understanding in the region. However it believes that until such a time the rights of all Palestinians are not secured, there can be no lasting peace. So, he continued, Islamic countries should be more sensitive in their efforts to solve this

problem and achieve a lasting peace in the region and the world.

"We have never sought war and nor have we ever tolerated aggression and this is the very nature of the Islamic ummah. Real peace lies in justice and not aggression," the Iranian president declared.

Expressing his pleasure over expansion of ties between Muslim countries and the Islamic Republic of Iran, President Khatami stated, "based on our Islamic and philanthropic duty with the clear perception of stances, we extend the hand of cordiality with the warm hand shake to all Muslim brethren, specifically our Kuwaiti brothers in the trust that we shall not waste the golden opportunity as the blessing of Allah that have brought our hearts close."

"We are once more stressing that we want peace and stability in the region and that it cannot be achieved without the cooperation of the regional countries," Khatami said.

President also expressed hope that the presence of inter-parliamentary delegations from Muslim countries here would pave the way for cementing the bonds among the Muslim countries.

The speaker of Kuwaiti National Assembly said, "the initiatives of the Iran's Majlis Speaker, Ali Akbar Nateq Nouri in 1995 for the convention of Muslim inter-parliamentary conference is a factor that would help strengthen relation and solidarity among the Muslim community."

"I had invariably said that the Islamic Republic of Iran had severely con-

demned Iraq's transgression over Kuwait while we had continuously and openly supported Iraq in its aggression against Iran during the eight years," said Ahmad al-Saadun.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran had always adopted a righteous stance based on the teachings of Islam and therefore is worthy of great significance," said the Kuwaiti speaker condemning the so-called latest peace deal between Palestine and the Zionists in Palestine in the presence of the U.S. President Bill Clinton, the Kuwaiti speaker said, "we have drawn a cancellation line on all of our expectations regarding the deal."

Iran-EU talks to be held in Vienna

TEHRAN - The second round of talks between Iran and the European Union Troika will be held in Vienna Friday, a Foreign Ministry source told the English daily Iran News Monday.

"During the one day meeting, to be attended by (Iran's) Deputy Foreign Minister for Euro-American Affairs, Morteza Sarmadi, economic issues, campaign against drugs and terrorism, environmental cooperation, political cooperation in regional issues, the Iraqi crisis, the Afghan imbroglio as well as various Middle East issues are on the agenda," said the unnamed source.

He said that Iran and the EU had entered a "new phase in their relations," adding that Iran had entered talks with the European Commission and was waiting for the results. "We are taking practical steps regarding the above-mentioned areas with Europe," he said.

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
